
PRIVACY POLICY

BACKGROUND:

Happy Energy Solutions Ltd. understands that your privacy is important to you and that you care about how your personal data is used. we respect and value the privacy of everyone who visits this website, www.freesolarcornwall.co.uk and will only collect and use personal data in ways that are described here, and in a way that is consistent with our obligations and your rights under the law.

Please read this Privacy Policy carefully and ensure that you understand it. Your acceptance of this Privacy Policy is requested when applying for one of our grants.

1. Definitions and Interpretation

In this Policy the following terms shall have the following meanings:

“Account”	means an account required to access and/or use certain areas and features of Our Site;
“Cookie”	means a small text file placed on your computer or device by Our Site when you visit certain parts of Our Site and/or when you use certain features of Our Site . Details of the Cookies used by Our Site are set out in Part 14, below; and
“Cookie Law”	means the relevant parts of the Privacy and Electronic Communications (EC Directive) Regulations 2003.

3. What Does This Policy Cover?

This Privacy Policy applies only to your use of **Our Site**. **Our Site** may contain links to other websites. Please note that **we** have no control over how your data is collected, stored, or used by other websites and **we** advise you to check the privacy policies of any such websites before providing any data to them.

4. **What Is Personal Data?**

Personal data is defined by the General Data Protection Regulation (EU Regulation 2016/679) (the “GDPR”) and the Data Protection Act 2018 (collectively, “the Data Protection Legislation”) as ‘any information relating to an identifiable person who can be directly or indirectly identified in particular by reference to an identifier’.

Personal data is, in simpler terms, any information about you that enables you to be identified. Personal data covers obvious information such as your name and contact details, but it also covers less obvious information such as identification numbers, electronic location data, and other online identifiers.

5. **What Are My Rights?**

Under the Data Protection Legislation, you have the following rights, which **we** will always work to uphold:

- a) The right to be informed about **Our** collection and use of your personal data. This Privacy Policy should tell you everything you need to know, but you can always contact **us** to find out more or to ask any questions using the details in Part 15.
- b) The right to access the personal data **we** hold about you. Part 13 will tell you how to do this.
- c) The right to have your personal data rectified if any of your personal data held by **us** is inaccurate or incomplete. Please contact **us** using the details in Part 15 to find out more.
- d) The right to be forgotten, i.e. the right to ask **us** to delete or otherwise dispose of any of your personal data that **we** hold. Please contact **us** using the details in Part 15 to find out more.
- e) The right to restrict (i.e. prevent) the processing of your personal data.
- f) The right to object to **us** using your personal data for a particular purpose or purposes.
- g) The right to withdraw consent. This means that, if **we are** relying on your consent as the legal basis for using your personal data, you are free to withdraw that consent at any time.
- h) The right to data portability. This means that, if you have provided personal data to **us** directly, **we are** using it with your consent or for the performance of a contract, and that data is processed using automated means, you can ask **us** for a copy of that personal data to re-use with another service or business in many cases.
- i) Rights relating to automated decision-making and profiling.

It is important that your personal data is kept accurate and up-to-date. If any of the personal data **we** hold about you changes, please keep **us** informed as long as **we** have that data.

With your permission and/or where permitted by law, **we** may also use your personal data for marketing purposes, which may include contacting you by email **AND/OR** telephone **AND/OR** text message **AND/OR** post with information, news, and offers on **Our** products **AND/OR** services. You will not be sent any unlawful marketing or spam. **we** will always work to fully protect your rights and comply with **Our** obligations under the Data Protection Legislation and the Privacy and Electronic Communications (EC Directive) Regulations 2003, and you will always have the opportunity to opt-out.

We use the following automated system for carrying out certain kinds of profiling. If at any point you wish to query any action that **we** take on the basis of this or wish to request 'human intervention' (i.e. have someone review the action themselves, rather than relying only on the automated method), the Data Protection Legislation gives you the right to do so. Please contact **us** to find out more using the details in Part 15.

- The following automated profiling may take place:
 - Department for Work and Pension provide information on whether in receipt of benefits or not.

We will only use your personal data for the purpose(s) for which it was originally collected unless **we** reasonably believe that another purpose is compatible with that or those original purpose(s) and need to use your personal data for that purpose. If **we** do use your personal data in this way and you wish **us** to explain how the new purpose is compatible with the original, please contact **us** using the details in Part 15.

If **we** need to use your personal data for a purpose that is unrelated to, or incompatible with, the purpose(s) for which it was originally collected, **we** will inform you and explain the legal basis which allows **us** to do so.

In some circumstances, where permitted or required by law, **we** may process your

personal data without your knowledge or consent. This will only be done within the bounds of the Data Protection Legislation and your legal rights.

8. How Long Will You Keep My Personal Data?

We will not keep your personal data for any longer than is necessary in light of the reason(s) for which it was first collected. Your personal data will therefore be kept for the following periods (or, where there is no fixed period, the following factors will be used to determine how long it is kept):

9. How and Where Do You Store or Transfer My Personal Data?

We may store or transfer some or all of your personal data in countries that are not part of the European Economic Area (the “EEA” consists of all EU member states, plus Norway, Iceland, and Liechtenstein). These are known as “third countries” and may not have data protection laws that are as strong as those in the UK and/or the EEA. This means that **we** will take additional steps in order to ensure that your personal data is treated just as safely and securely as it would be within the UK and under the Data Protection Legislation as follows.

We share your data within the group of companies of which **we are** a part. Where this involves the transfer of personal data outside the EEA, **Our** group ensures that personal data is protected by requiring all companies within the group to follow the same rules with respect to personal data usage. We will only transfer your personal data to third countries whose levels of data protection are deemed ‘adequate’ by the European Commission. More information is available from the [European Commission.](#)

The security of your personal data is essential to **us**, and to protect your data, **we** take a number of important measures, including the following:

- limiting access to your personal data to those employees, agents, contractors, and other third parties with a legitimate need to know and ensuring that they are subject to duties of confidentiality;
- procedures for dealing with data breaches (the accidental or unlawful destruction, loss, alteration, unauthorised disclosure of, or access to, your personal data) including notifying you and/or the Information Commissioner's Office where **we are** legally required to do so.

10. Do You Share My Personal Data?

We will not share any of your personal data with any third parties for any purposes, subject to the following exceptions.

If **we** sell, transfer, or merge parts of **Our** business or assets, your personal data may be transferred to a third party. Any new owner of **Our** business may continue to use your personal data in the same way(s) that **we** have used it, as specified in this Privacy Policy.

In some limited circumstances, **we** may be legally required to share certain personal data, which might include yours, if **we are** involved in legal proceedings or complying with legal obligations, a court order, or the instructions of a government authority.

We may share your personal data with other companies in **Our** group for the provision of the contract. This includes subsidiaries **AND/OR** **Our** holding company and its subsidiaries.

We may sometimes contract with the following third parties to supply certain products **AND/OR** services.

If any of your personal data is shared with a third party, as described above, **we** will take steps to ensure that your personal data is handled safely, securely, and in accordance with your rights, **Our** obligations, and the third party's obligations under the law, as described above in Part 9.

If any personal data is transferred outside of the EEA, **we** will take suitable steps in order to ensure that your personal data is treated just as safely and securely as it would be within the UK and under the Data Protection Legislation, as explained above in Part 9.

If **we** sell, transfer, or merge parts of **Our** business or assets, your personal data may be transferred to a third party. Any new owner of **Our** business may continue to use your personal data in the same way(s) that **we** have used it, as specified in this Privacy Policy.

In some limited circumstances, **we** may be legally required to share certain personal data, which might include yours, if **we are** involved in legal proceedings or complying with legal obligations, a court order, or the instructions of a government authority.]

11. How Can I Control My Personal Data?

11.1 In addition to your rights under the Data Protection Legislation, set out in Part 5, when you submit personal data via **Our Site**, you may be given options to restrict **our use** of your personal data. In particular, **we** aim to give you strong controls on **our use** of your data for direct marketing purposes (including the ability to opt-out of receiving emails from **us** which you may do by unsubscribing using the links provided in **Our** emails and at the point of providing your details and by managing your Account).

11.2 You may also wish to sign up to one or more of the preference services operating in the UK: The Telephone Preference Service ("the TPS"), the Corporate Telephone Preference Service ("the CTPS"), and the Mailing Preference Service ("the MPS"). These may help to prevent you receiving unsolicited marketing. Please note, however, that these services will not prevent you from receiving marketing communications that you have consented to receiving.

12. Can I Withhold Information?

You may access **Our Site** without providing any personal data at all. However, to use all features and functions available on **Our Site** you may be required to submit or allow for the collection of certain data.

You may restrict **our use** of Cookies. For more information, see Part 14 and **Our** Cookie Policy.

13. How Can I Access My Personal Data?

If you want to know what personal data, **we** have about you, you can ask **us** for details of that personal data and for a copy of it (where any such personal data is held). This is known as a “subject access request”.

All subject access requests should be made in writing and sent to the email or postal addresses shown in Part 15. To make this as easy as possible for you, a Subject Access Request Form is available for you to use. You do not have to use this form, but it is the easiest way to tell **us** everything **we** need to know to respond to your request as quickly as possible.

There is not normally any charge for a subject access request. If your request is ‘manifestly unfounded or excessive’ (for example, if you make repetitive requests) a fee may be charged to cover **Our** administrative costs in responding.

We will respond to your subject access request within less than one month and, in any case, not more than one month of receiving it. Normally, **we** aim to provide a complete response, including a copy of your personal data within that time. In some cases, however, particularly if your request is more complex, more time may be required up to a maximum of three months from the date **we** receive your request. You will be kept fully informed of **Our** progress.

14. How Do You Use Cookies?

Our Site may place and access certain first-party Cookies on your computer or device. First-party Cookies are those placed directly by **us** and are used only by **us**. **We** use Cookies to facilitate and improve your experience of **Our Site** and to provide and improve **Our** products **AND/OR** services. **We** have carefully chosen these Cookies and have taken steps to ensure that your privacy and personal data is protected and respected at all times.

All Cookies used by and on **Our Site** are used in accordance with current Cookie Law.

Before Cookies are placed on your computer or device, you will be shown a pop-up requesting your consent to set those Cookies. By giving your consent to the placing of Cookies you are enabling **us** to provide the best possible experience and service to you. You may, if you wish, deny consent to the placing of Cookies; however certain features of **Our Site** may not function fully or as intended. You will be given the opportunity to allow only first-party Cookies and block third-party Cookies.

Certain features of **Our Site** depend on Cookies to function. Cookie Law deems these Cookies to be “strictly necessary”. These Cookies are shown in the table below. Your consent will not be sought to place these Cookies, but it is still important that you are aware of them. You may still block these Cookies by changing your internet browser’s settings as detailed below, but please be aware that **Our Site** may not work properly if you do so. **we** have taken great care to ensure that your privacy is not at risk by allowing them.
